Site Manager, ANU Security, guests, and visitors must check the RFS website for the following day's Fire Danger Rating (FDR) every day after 4:00 PM. An up-to-date guest and visitor register is required from October 1 to March 31 or whenever the FDR is High.

Bushfire Evacuation Matrix

DO NOT LEAVE CAMPUS unless officially directed by emergency services or you have confirmed Egress routes and roads are clear from fire, smoke, fallen trees and roadblocks. Liaise with Emergency services before leaving campus

Bushfire Impact

Forest:
 If students or staff are working in the forest, ensure site manager knows your location and return ETA.
If you are caught in a bushfire. Stay calm, do not panic.
 NEVER attempt to outrun a bushfire. Where possible, ring '000' and seek fire service response. Attempt to find an open area such as a road or walking trail or open space. If you cannot find an open space travel across the slope away from bushfire. Never move upslope. If you find an open rock shelf, road, path, or open area, consider remaining there until the fire front has passed. Stay low and cover mouth and nose.
 If a road is found, and it is considered safe to do so, travel down road to open campus and building area.

Building Fire:
 If a campus building you are occupying is subject to smoke and ember attack:

1. Close all windows and doors.
2. Call 000 and advise the fire services.
3. If possible, place a wet towel or cloth at the base of external doors to restrict smoke or ember entry.
4. If possible, fill up containers with water and have them ready.
5. Advise the campus site manager of your actions.
6. Monitor the situation. Drink water if possible. Stay inside and await the arrival of campus staff or emergency services.
7. Heavy smoke will reduce light levels. Remain inside with the lights on.
8. When the smoke clears, carefully venture outside, and assess the building for any damage. Return inside if it is not safe to stay outside due to residual smoke or embers.
9. Await the arrival of fire services or campus staff.

ALTERNATIVELY:

Evacuate directly to the London Shed (bushfire safe refuge).
