- In terms of when we made the determination on 8 May to switch to an alternate fire evacuation route, in addition to you, who assisted in making that determination (did it also include our own WHS team and safety and wellbeing)? Sorry, the decision to switch to an alternate route was not made on 8 May. On 10 May the email to notify the alternate route AA2 was distributed based on what was documented as building-specific in all fire evacuation diagrams for Kambri. No assistance to make the determination was provided by Safety and Wellbeing or our WH&S team.
- In terms of the false alarm on the 21<sup>st</sup> May, what caused the alarm and what time did it occur. Following on from Joe's report, the alarm went off at 12.50pm. The cause was due to ANU Thrive using the kitchen and the smoke triggered the alarm for the evacuation.
- Can you confirm the exact time the email went out to impacted buildings on the 28<sup>th</sup> May notifying them that the main evacuation point had been cleared and would be used as the primary evacuation point and the alternate evacuation point was no longer required to be used. Hi Jeremy and Sylvia, please find my response in blue as below.

In terms of between 28 April and 10 May, are we saying that enough of the lawn was still clear of tents to allow it remain as a primary evacuation route? The lawns initially had five to six tents and the ANUSA marquee, which did not impact the evacuation route. However, starting from 29 April -10 May, the number of tents, banners, flags, signage, tables, chairs, and milk crates increased, occupying the Kambri Lawn and the area around University Avenue, which began to impact the evacuation route and Assembly Area 1 (AA1).

One of the questions from OVC was how did we determine the alternate evacuation area, I see the attached comms notifying them on 10 May, did we also send out a diagram to indicate this location? Correct, as per the email sent on 10 May, Kambri Operations attached the evacuation diagrams for buildings 153, 154, 155, and 156, highlighting Assembly Area 2 (AA2). You can find this information in the attached PDF under the Attachments section. Primary Assembly Area 1 (AA1) and Secondary Assembly Area 2 (AA2) have been determined as building-specific in all fire evacuation diagrams for Kambri as part of emergency planning.

Also following the incident on 21 May, in the short term did we communicate with the local areas about the alternate evacuation point. Was there any comms to the impacted areas reminding them of the alternate evacuation point (by FS or SAW). Kambri Operations did not remind other areas about the alternate evacuation points after 21 May, noting thar we in B153 were the impacted area. I cannot confirm if SAW communicated with local areas after the incident on 21 May. However, we did

communicate with Deanne Drummond from Fenner Hall via Teams after the incident to ensure their residents were safe. Subsequently, the next communications from Kambri Operations were sent on 28 May with advice from SAW to inform Kambri local areas that Assembly Area 1 (AA1) was now accessible and clear for use according to the local emergency evacuation diagrams.

#### Hi Sylvia,

Please find the chronological timeline of events as below from Kambri Ops perspective and please advise if you need anything further.

#### Timeline

- 29 April 2024
  - Kambri Operations observed the setup of approximately five to six tents and ANUSA marquees on the Kambri Lawns (see image below).
  - We promptly informed ANU Security, and Lucas was already aware and present on site to provide the necessary support to the students.
     Additionally, we notified the Head of Hall at Fenner, as this setup may affect the residents.
  - From 29 April- 8 May, we have observed an increase in the number of tents, banners, flags, signage, tables, chairs, and milk crates occupying the Kambri Lawn and the area around University Avenue.
- 10 May 2024
  - Kambri Operations sent a reminder (Kambri Assembly Areas AA2 Reminder attached) with evacuation diagrams to all Kambri building managers, fire wardens, the students' association, commercial services, the venues and functions team, and ANU Security. This reminder was for buildings B153 Cultural Centre, B154 Di Ridell Student Centre, B155 Marie Reay Teaching Centre, and B156 Health and Wellbeing Centre.
  - The purpose of this reminder was to ensure all Kambri stakeholders were familiar with the secondary Assembly Area (AA2), as the primary Assembly Area (AA1) in close proximity to the Kambri Lawns was occupied due to the student encampment protest.
- 21 May 2024
  - The fire alarm was triggered in Kambri Cultural Centre B153 and Fenner Hall B152 due to a potential fire caused by ANU Thrive in the Kambri kitchen. ACT Fire Services attended the scene.
  - ANU Security, the Kambri Operations team, and Fenner staff conducted the fire evacuation for B153 Kambri Cultural Centre and B152 Fenner Hall. During the evacuation, Assembly Area 1 was found to be inaccessible due to severe congestion caused by the encampment on and around Kambri Lawns.

Some evacuees from the Kambri Cultural Centre were redirected to Assembly Area 2 (AA2), while others were guided towards the Kambri outdoor Amphitheatre.

- A Figtree hazard report (HAZ0003713) was raised to address this issue.
- An email highlighting the issue was sent to Sylvia Mansell, Associate Director of F&S Corporate, and Lucas Owen, ANU Security Operations Manager.
- 28 May 2024
  - The Safety and Wellbeing team requested to review the communications intended for Kambri stakeholders.
  - Under the guidance of the ANU Safety and Wellbeing team, Kambri Operations drafted communications to notify stakeholders that Assembly Area 1 (AA1) was now accessible and clear for use according to the local emergency evacuation diagrams (Comms for Kambri precinct Assembly Area attached).
  - The Kambri Operations team distributed these communications to the relevant Kambri stakeholders. (Kambri precinct Assembly Area update attached)
- Other information
  - Primary Assembly Area 1 (AA1) and Secondary Assembly Area 2 (AA2) have been documented as building-specific in all fire evacuation diagrams for Kambri as part of emergency planning.
  - Kambri Operations were requested by ANU Security to assist in organising an additional set of bins and increasing the level of cleaning around the lawns as necessary on 2 May 2024.
  - Kambri Operations raised a Maximo request and emailed the request on 3 May 2024.
  - FixMyCampus confirmed that the bin and cleaning requests were actioned on 8 May 2024.
  - The Head of Hall at Fenner reached out to the Kambri team for support in identifying safe and quiet spaces for Fenner Hall students. This request was supported by Kambri.

As you may know, ANU has been called to Senate Estimates and the VC has asked for some information from your shop. I apologise in advance, but it would be useful to have this information by COB tomorrow.

I have attached a briefing paper template to help guide the formatting. The VC is after the following information (but you may have some additional information or data which would be useful).

 Timeline of the fire evacuation site in Kambri. This should commence from the end of April when the camp first set up, and how and where we documented that this was a primary site for evaluation. How did we determine secondary locations and how did we inform people? When the fire alarm evacuation failed, how was this recorded, what was the process to ladder up eventually to the VC. This should include dates. We then need the timeline to map the Monday request to vacate through to returning the Kambri lawns to the primary site for evacuations and how we have told people this information.







#### **Dear Genevieve**

As Director of Facilities and services I completely agree that from a health and safety perspective restoration of the primary muster point for fire evacuation for the precinct is an absolute necessity. As Director of Facilities and Services I will be executing my authority to have the encampment moved on to ensure the continued safety of our staff and students immediately impacted due to this impediment to our primary fire evacuation route.

In conjunction with my Senior manager's of security Joe Ducie and Lucas Owen our initial preference was to move the encampment on first thing tomorrow morning, being 8am Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> May 2024, we understand the sensitivities around this so ensuring we had Australian Federal Police (AFP) support when we enact these powers to have the encampment pack up and move from the University we have contacted them immediately requesting that support, unfortunately the AFP have confirmed they are unable to support the University tomorrow with staff on hand as we move the encampment on. Given recent issues that have occurred at Sydney and Melbourne campuses in similar instances we feel this support from AFP to assist with any orders to vacate encampments is also absolutely necessary, again ensuring the safety of our staff and students. AFP have confirmed they could support the University at the earliest being Monday 27<sup>th</sup> May 8am, again stating the importance of this support we will defer the orders to members of the encampment till this date, the security team will continue liaising with AFP over the weekend to discuss tactical operational measures to ensure a smooth pack up of the encampment.

With the above in mind, this still leaves us with the risk of having an alternate muster point for any fire evacuations or emergency events that occur in the Kambri precinct between now and Monday morning. To mitigate this in the short term we will be bringing in additional security staff under our security contractor MSS to assist and facilitate any emergency evacuations that are required as a result of fire alarm. Whilst my team and I feel this is an adequate mitigation measure in the short term, it is not a long term solution to manage fire egress and the safety of our staff and students. I have copied in Joe Ducie and Lucas Owen to this email who can add to the processes our security guards will be briefed on in terms of facilitating and assisting our various fire wardens to ensure safe egress in terms of fire alarm that may occur over the weekend, they can also brief this group on the operational approach to moving on the encampment, I will also ask Joe and Lucas to provide an outline of the message they will be delivering to the members of the encampment and the process that will be undertaken.

We will continue to update this group as new information comes to hand or should any change be required to the plan we have outlined above.

Hi Grady and Chris,

Thank you for your emails and your ongoing care and commitment for our University community.

I am deeply concerned by the concerns raised below about the WHS risks in the Kambri precinct. I know when the encampment first arose, we turned our mind to the risks to our various safety plans and evacuation protocols, and we believed we could manage the risk. However, it is clear following the fire drills earlier this week that we have need to revise our approach as relying on a secondary evacuation site has not worked. Furthermore, the coming exam week will see an marked increase in foot traffic which would further complicate reliance on the secondary sites.

To my mind, this means that the potential risk to our community has reached an intolerable

threshold and we cannot continue to have an encampment in Kambri, as it compromises our safety protocols and the creates risk to our community. We have multiple buildings, with a range of different occupants, and their collective safety must be paramount. I am concerned about the implications to loss of life or injury if an incident was to occur in this precinct.

I have 'cc' Jeremy Matthews and Lucas Owen from our Facilities and Services division into this email for immediate and urgent attention. I will need a clear plan to ensure we can get back into a compliant state vis-à-vis our safety protocols. This must include both a plan to remove the encampment in a timely and compassionate manner, as well as ensuring that we have additional controls in place to manage any time between now and the space being vacated.

I expect a response and a plan before COB today.

I am forwarding the report (below) about a recent evacuation of Fenner Hall and the issues caused by the encampment which is the primary evacuation point. This has been reported in Figtree.

I am very concerned about the safety of our staff and students as other buildings in Kambri Precinct have the lawn as their primary evacuation point.

We could reissue and remind all our staff and students of their secondary evacuation point. However, in my view it would be unsatisfactory and indefensible from a safety point of view to accommodate an unnecessary political encampment and put our staff and students at a safety risk.

I recommend that we give an instruction to Security and Facilities that the encampment is removed immediately.

The below complaint was raised after Tuesday's building evacuation in Kambri. Mark, WHS Manager, has spoken with the Chief Warden of Fenner Hall who confirmed that there was some confusion and students did require secondary reminding of which Assembly Point to use. The Chief Warden of Fenner otherwise reported a smooth evacuation.

Despite the Chief Warden of Fenner being satisfied with the Fenner evacuation, I can't ignore the complaint below of B153 evacuation. If the encampment is to remain, I recommend we review the temporary evacuation arrangements and re-communicate the temporary arrangements to relevant staff and students through the usual channels as well as update signage in the buildings. Once the encampment ceases, we will need to re-communicate the change and update signage again at that point. The obvious preference would be to not have an encampment occupying a central Emergency Assembly Area.

Dear Sylvia and Lucas.

An emergency building evacuation was conducted at Kambri Cultural Centre B153 today at 12:50pm. The building, which was hosting ongoing classes, was successfully cleared by the Kambri and Security team to Assembly Area 1. Due to the proximity, Fenner Hall also required an evacuation, with all students directed to the designated Assembly Area 1 (AA1).

During the evacuation, Assembly Area 1 was found to be inaccessible due to severe congestion caused by an encampment. This obstruction posed significant safety issues as students and staff attempted to move toward the designated assembly area.


The congestion at Assembly Area 1 due to the encampment created a potential risk of injury due to overcrowding and obstructed pathways in and around Kambri Lawns. The inability to use the designated Assembly Area 1 lead to confusion and delays in the evacuation process, affecting overall safety.

Some evacuees were redirected to Assembly Area 2 (AA2), whilst other were guided towards the Kambri outdoor Amphitheatre. (Image below)

We have created a Figtree hazard report HAZ0003713 to address this issue.

Our recommendations are to re-evaluate the current assembly area locations to ensure they remain accessible and can handle the expected number of evacuees without congestion. Additionally, we suggest collaborating with ANU UniSafe to relocate any obstructions that may impede evacuation routes and assembly areas.

The incident today highlighted the need for improved management of assembly areas. By addressing the identified risks and implementing the recommended mitigations, we can enhance the safety and efficiency of future evacuations in Kambri.
