

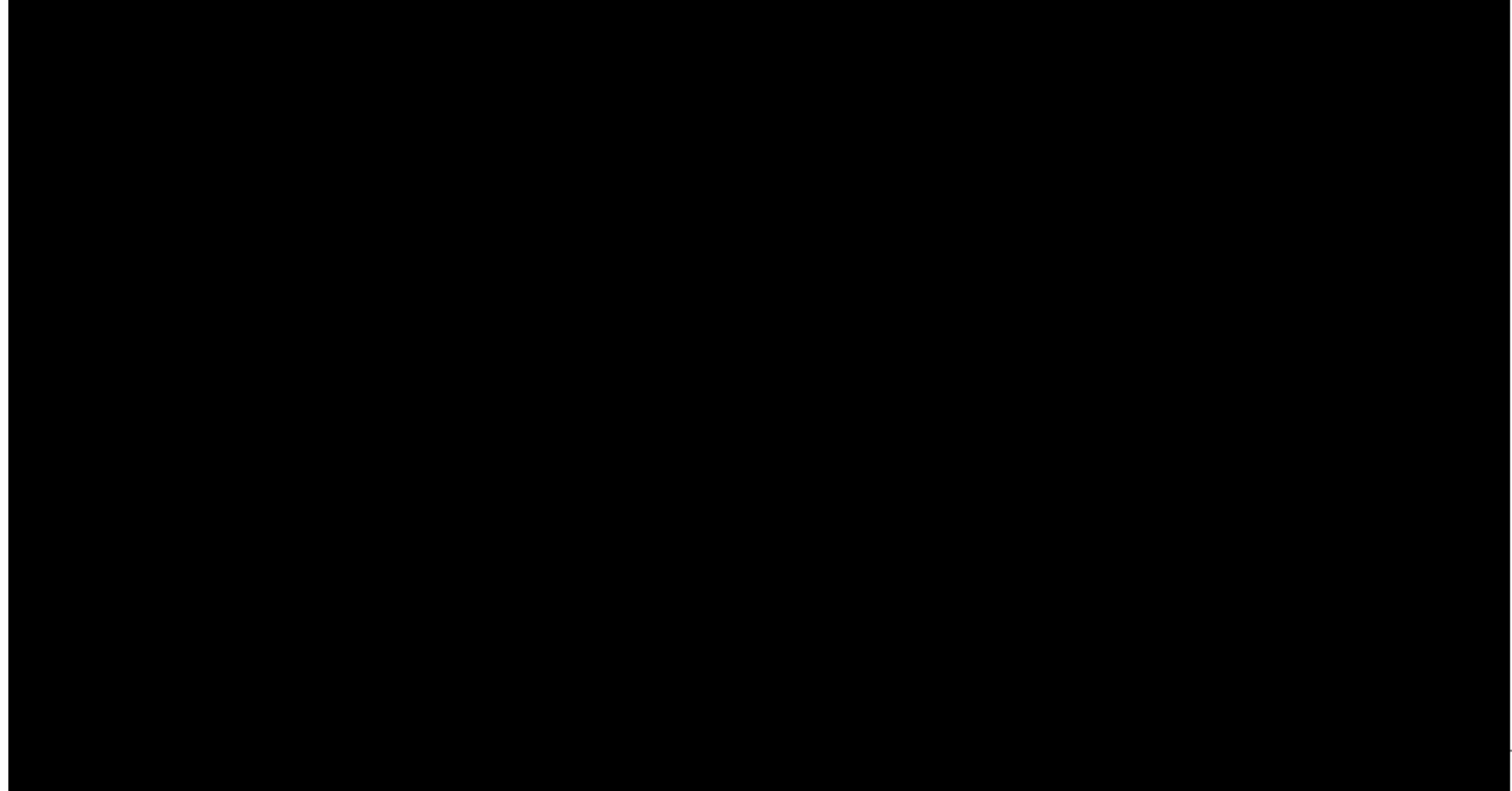

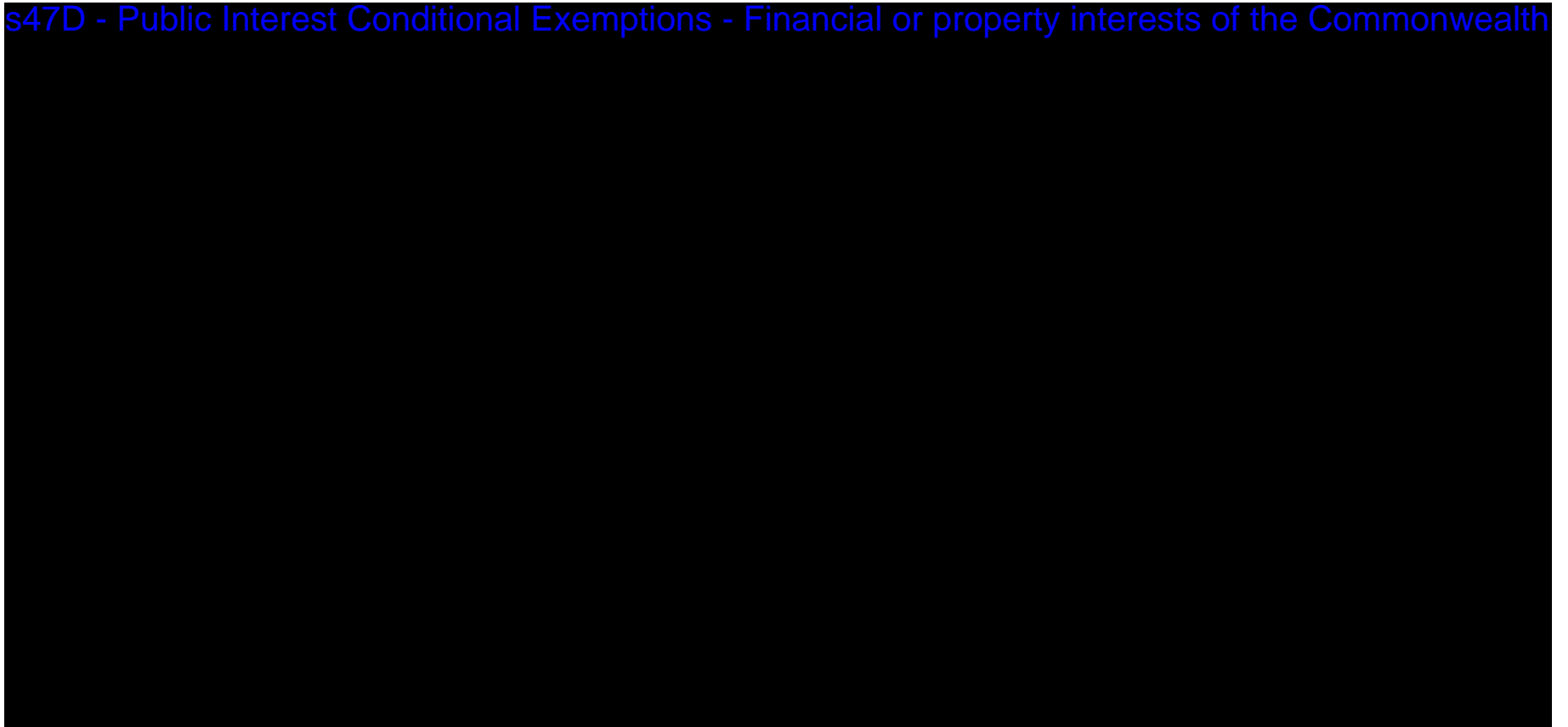

# Improving National Safety Capability

## Partnerships with the Australian Defence Force (ADF)

- BAE Systems and Thales advance and safeguard Australia's security and economic interests by leveraging cutting-edge technologies and complex engineering expertise.
- BAE and Thales support the ADF on projects including:
  - Sustainment of the RAAF's fleet of 72 F-35 fighter jets, where BAE is responsible for 15% workshare in each aircraft (excluding propulsion systems).
  - Design, development and integration of the 'Nulka' anti-missile decoy system since 1988.
  - The JORN defence system which provides wide-area surveillance over QLD, WA and NT.
  - Evolved SeaSparrow Missiles, which protect warships from advanced anti-ship cruise missiles.
  - Air Traffic Management and Simulation Training for the RAAF.
  - Protected Mobility Vehicles that protect Australian troops on the ground in hostile areas.
  - Design, manufacture and export of world-leading sonar technology for the RAN and Allied Navies.



# Supporting Australian Industry

## BAE Systems

- Supports 1,600 Australian companies as part of their supply chain, spending more than \$700 million with them in 2021.
- 26% of total spending was with Australian SMEs.
- Employs over 6,300 full time employees at over 30 sites in Australia.
- Facilitates opportunities for Australian SMEs to enter their international supply chain through their Global Access Program.

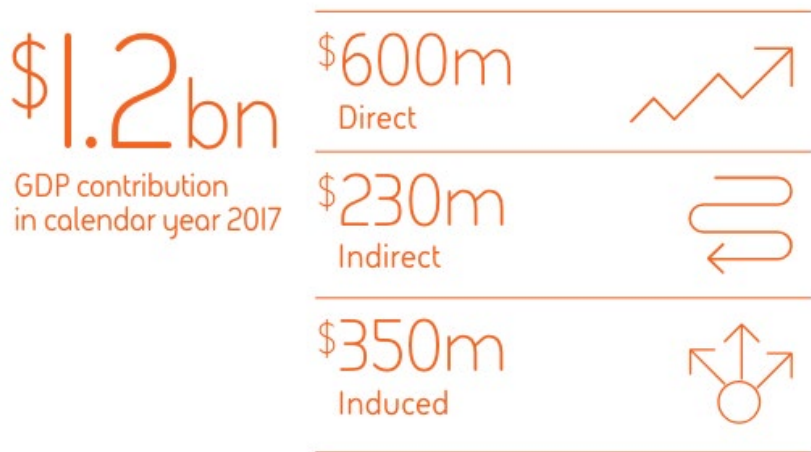

# Supporting Australian Industry

## BAE Systems

- Contributes approximately \$1.2b to Australian GDP each year.
- For every \$1 of BAE output, the Australian economy (GDP) is boosted by \$2, due to indirect effects through BAE's supply chain and induced consumption spending.

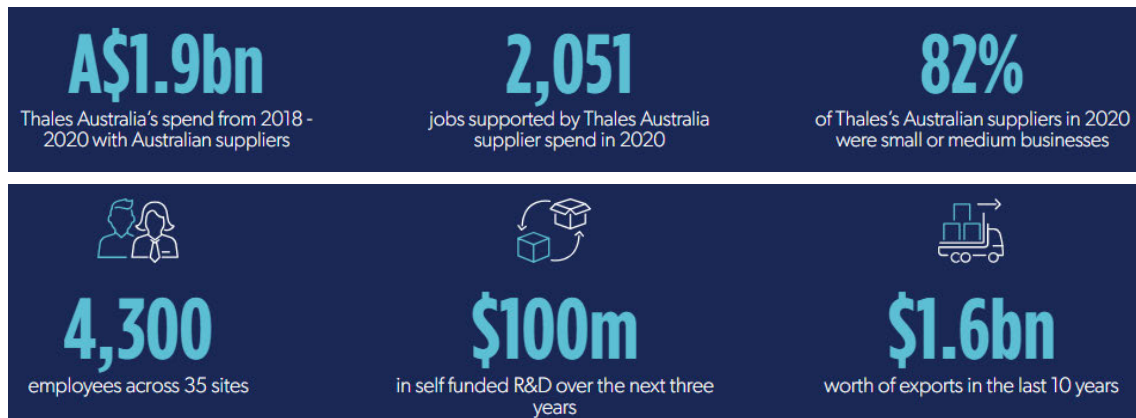

# Supporting Australian Industry

## Thales

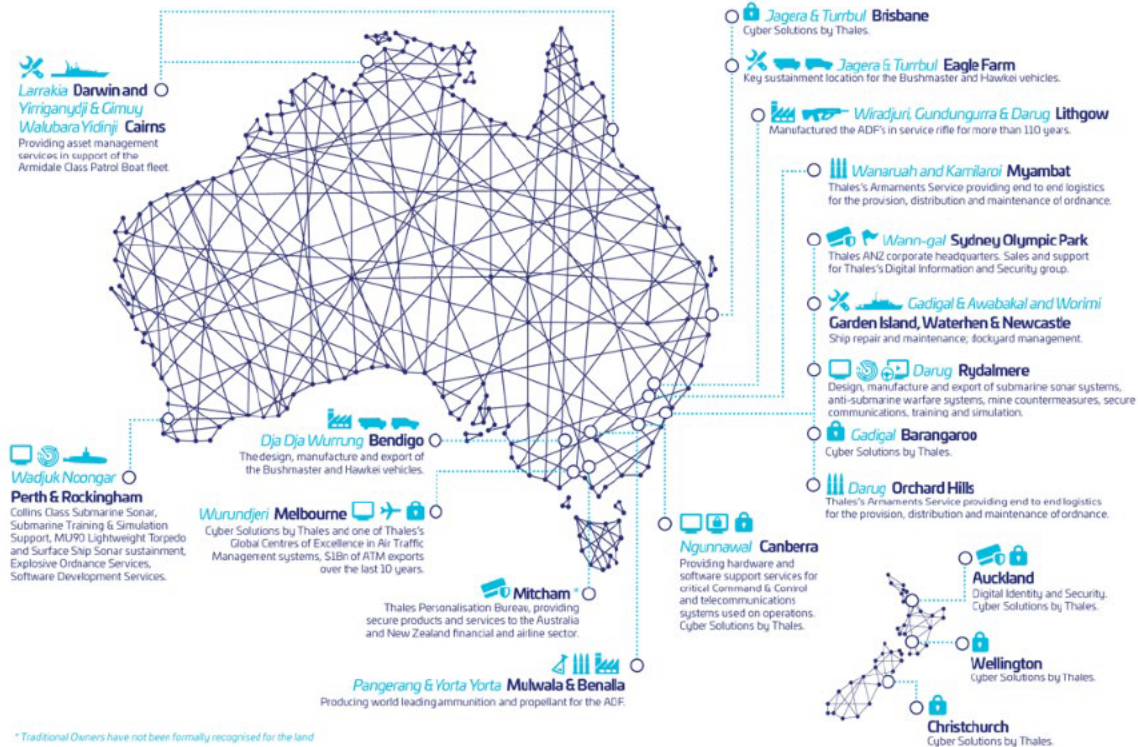
- Employs 4,300 people across 35 sites in Australia.
- Includes 1,500+ Small-to-Medium Enterprises (SMEs) in their supply chain, accounting for 82% of Thales Australia's total suppliers.
- \$100m in self-funded R&D expected in the next 3 years
- An active participant in the Australian Government's Global Supply Chain Program since 2010, in which they seek out opportunities for Australian Industry within their global supply chain.

## Thales' Sites Across Australia and New Zealand

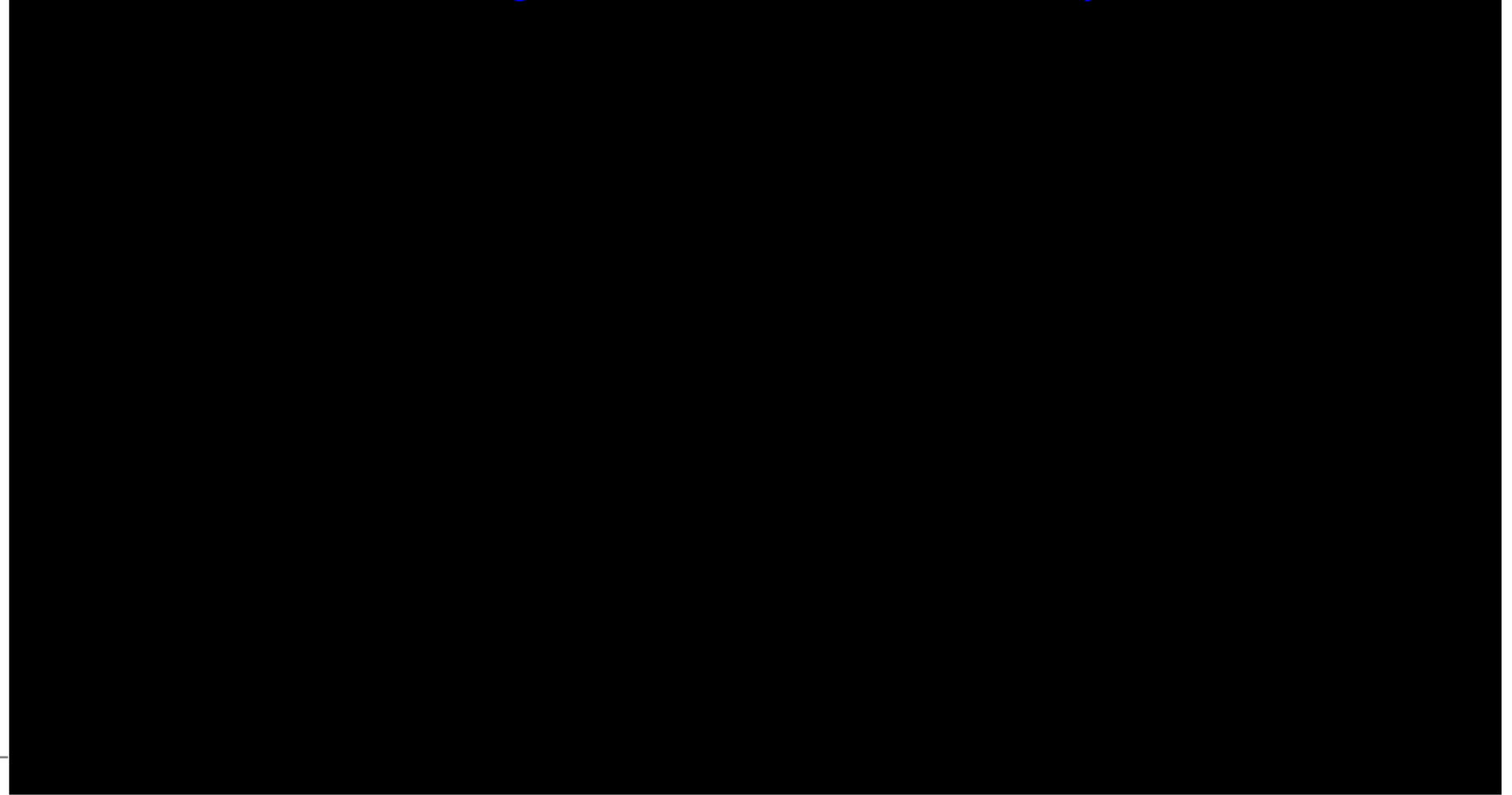
