GATENBY PRIZE FOR EXCELLENCE IN INTERNAL MEDICINE CONDITIONS OF AWARD

1. INTRODUCTION AND RECOGNITION

Each year the School of Medicine and Psychology may offer a prize known as the Gatenby Prize for Excellence in Internal Medicine.

The value of the prize awarded is \$500.

The prize will be on offer from 2024 to 2027.

Funding for this prize has been provided by Professor Paul Gatenby. Professor Gatenby was the Foundation Dean of the ANU Medical School (now the School of Medicine and Psychology), when it was established in 2002. He is a distinguished and inspiring physician-researcher, particularly in the field of clinical immunology. Since his first days as a medical student, Professor Gatenby has exhibited continued dedication to excellence in medical education, with a particular focus on clinical science and acumen.

2. ELIGIBILITY

The award is available each year to an ANU student who is:

- (a) a domestic or international student;
- (b) enrolled in Year 4 of the Doctor of Medicine and Surgery (MChD) program at the ANU College of Health and Medicine;
- (c) shortlisted in the top 25 students in Internal Medicine during Year 3 (based on written and OSCE examination results); AND
- (d) achieved the highest score in Internal Medicine during Year 4 (based on written, OSCE and Long Case examination results).

3. SELECTION AND CONSTRAINTS

Selection is made on the basis of being shortlisted in the top 25 students in Internal Medicine during Year 3 (based on written and OSCE examination results); AND achieved the highest score in Internal Medicine during Year 4 (based on written, OSCE and Long Case examination results).

The School of Medicine and Psychology reserves the right to make no award if it considers there is no applicant of sufficient merit. The School may also vary the number of prizes if multiple winners are identified by splitting the prize.

4. RECIPIENT OBLIGATIONS

The awarding of a prize is based on the information provided to the University. A prize may be declined by the recipient once they have been notified as the prize winner. This must be provided in writing to the School of Medicine and Psychology no later than 30 days from notification.

If the prize is accepted by the recipient, they agree to the Publication of their name.

In some instances the recipient may be asked to:

- 1) write a letter of thanks to the donor;
- 2) participate in marketing activities and/or asked to provide a reflective statement.

5. REVIEW OF PRIZE

The award will be reviewed:

- (a) at the conclusion of the period outlined in section 1;
- (b) if any eligibility requirements are to be amended; or
- (c) after 3 years

whichever is earliest.

6. VARIATION TO CONDITIONS OF AWARD

In exceptional circumstances and on a case-by-case basis, these conditions of award may be varied by the Director, School of Medicine and Psychology on the recommendation of the Professor of Medicine
