ACT PATHOLOGY YEAR TWO PATHOLOGY PRIZE CONDITIONS OF AWARD

1. INTRODUCTION AND RECOGNITION

Each year the ANU Medical School may offer a prize known as the ACT Pathology Year Two Pathology Prize.

This prize was instituted in order to promote knowledge of and interest in pathology as part of the basic sciences program in medicine.

The value of the prize awarded is \$500 – monetary.

The prize will be on offer from 2024 to 2027

Funding for this prize is provided by ACT Pathology, Canberra Health Services.

2. ELIGIBILITY

The award is available each year to an ANU Doctor of Medicine and Surgery (MChD) student who:

- (a) is enrolled in Year Two of the MChD at the School of Medicine and Psychology;
- (b) whose performance in the pathology components of the Year Two written examinations was assessed by the Selection Committee as outstanding reflecting comprehensive knowledge and application of Pathology issues at the Year Two level; and
- (c) does not fail any other component of the Year Two examination.

3. SELECTION AND CONSTRAINTS

The members of the Selection Committee shall be drawn by the Director, School of Medicine and Psychology (or delegate), and will include appropriate representation from the Academic Unit of Pathology within ACT Pathology.

The School of Medicine and Psychology reserves the right to make no award if it considers there is no applicant of sufficient merit. The School of Medicine and Psychology may also vary the number of prizes if multiple winners are identified by splitting the prize.

4. RECIPIENT OBLIGATIONS

The awarding of a prize is based on the information provided to the University. A prize may be declined by the recipient once they have been notified as the prize winner. This must be provided in writing to neu.medicalschool@anu.edu.au no later than 30 days from notification.

If the prize is accepted by the recipient, they agree to the Publication of their name.

In some instances the recipient may be asked to:

- 1) write a letter of thanks to the donor;
- 2) participate in marketing activities and/or asked to provide a reflective statement.

5. REVIEW OF PRIZE

The award will be reviewed:

- (a) at the conclusion of the period outlined in section 1; or
 - (b) if any eligibility requirements are to be amended
 - (c) after 3 years
- whichever is earliest.

6. VARIATION TO CONDITIONS OF AWARD

In exceptional circumstances and on a case-by-case basis, these conditions of award may be varied by the Director on the recommendation of the Chair of the Selection Committee.
