Purpose:

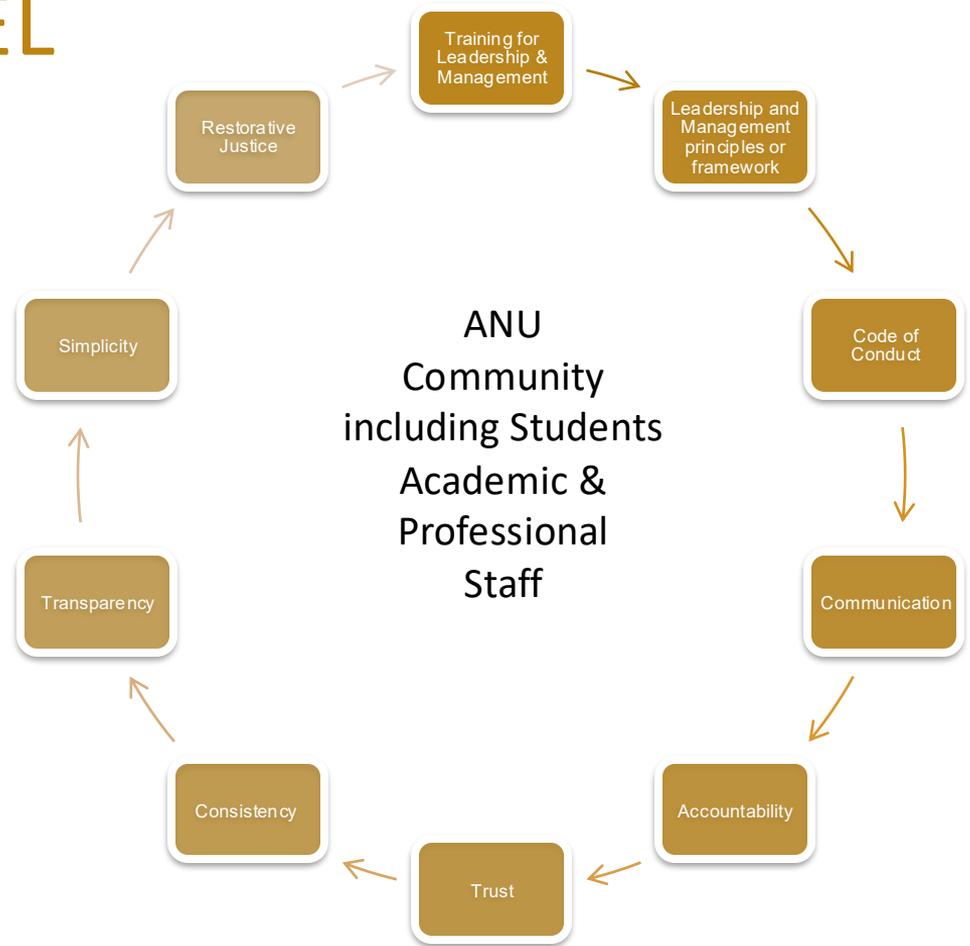
Facilitate a comprehensive Nixon Review Implementation Plan by:

- To provide additional commentary
- Sense-testing and feedback
- Considering the totality of proposed actions and identifying any gaps
- Amplifying connections between working groups
- Connect outputs from different working groups into a coherent whole
- Provide implementation phasing recommendations

- 10 common themes found among all working groups



Theme 1: Leadership and Management Professional Development

Problem:

- Lack of continuity in leadership and management training
- No compulsory training for ANU managers or leaders

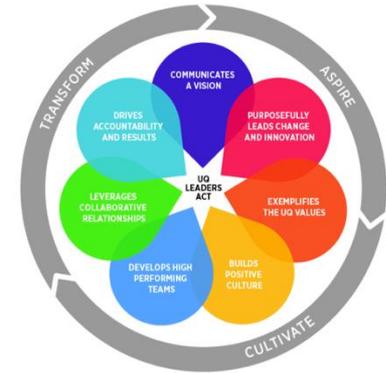

Theme 2: Leadership and Management Principles or Framework

Problem:

- No University-wide leadership principles or framework
- Varying leadership and management expectations
- Absence of principles / framework and impact on promotion

Theme 3: Code of Conduct: Purpose, Implementation, Clarity

Problem:

- Unchecked Code of Conduct breaches
- Perception of 'untouchable' individuals, e.g., high income researchers, senior leadership members
- Lack of comprehensive discrimination clauses, e.g., SES / social class, antisemitism, is missing
- Significant power imbalances among University stakeholders

Set clear, positive behaviour expectations of all ANU community members, e.g., rewarding examples of positive campus culture impact, academic citizenry, mentorship, professional services work etc	Yes	Yes	Yes
Revise Code of Conduct with more detail around discriminatory behaviours, communication expectations, bullying and harassment examples	Yes	Yes	Yes
Rework process for reporting breaches with transparent timeframes for resolution	Yes	Yes	Yes
Produce clear communication guidelines / expectations for all ANU community members, e.g., Teams, email, phone, face-to-face dialogues, message groups etc.	Yes	Yes	Yes



Theme 4: Communication

Problem:

- Lack of communication consistency and continuity between key University stakeholders
- Website difficult to navigate / find information, out-of-date information
- Unreliable cascades of information from 'top-down' hierarchies
- Lack of holistic, shared true story about ANU and its overall identity

Full ANU website audit, review and rework, with emphasis on ease of navigation and information location, to be incorporated into new strategic plan	No	Yes	Yes

More clear, direct communication between stakeholders, removal of ambiguity, continuity of information between policies, procedures, and communications	No	Yes	Yes



Theme 5: Accountability

Problem:

- Lack of senior leadership, authority, governance committee, College continuity, or central responsibility for IDEA, to include implementation of action plans
- Perception of leaders as unaccountable for mistakes, some of which have / had community-wide impact
- No continuity or transparency around accountability, what it looks like
- Perception that people will not be held to account for Code of Conduct breaches

Theme 6: Trust

Problem: Deep institution-wide distrust

- of leadership and management
- of policy and procedural implementation and action
- of future job security
- thereby resulting in intensive use of external forums, e.g., Reddit

Consistent, timely, clear and transparent communication lines between senior leadership and campus community (more than 'On Campus' newsletter)	No	Yes	Yes
Whole-of-University creation of new ANU Strategic Plan with multiple ways to contribute, eg, working groups, surveys, open feedback portals etc	Yes	Yes	Yes
Reassure community of end-of-year financial position, job security, and articulate plans for 2026 strategic planning	No	Yes	Yes



Theme 7: Consistency

Problem:

- Inconsistent communication
- Inconsistent applications of policy and procedure, e.g., workload models
- Inconsistent application(s) of Code of Conduct. Cuts across accountability – applies to some areas / individuals and not others
- Competing demands and priorities increase likelihood of problematic behaviour, e.g., cutting corners, mistakes, oversights of policy and/or procedure

Improve consistency in lines of communication through 'On campus', formalised tabling of items from SLG through to College and School-level leadership groups	Yes	Yes	Yes
Ensure University-wide leader and manager awareness—and implementation—of policy and procedure, especially related to WHS, workload	Yes	Yes	Yes
Act consistently on Code of Conduct breaches to restore trust in staff that breaches will be actioned accordingly.	No	Yes	Yes



Theme 8: Transparency

Problem:

- Perception of lack of real transparency of financial position of University
- Perceived and real conflicts of interests in senior leadership: investigations, governance, committees, tender and procurement processes
- Perception of excessive expenses among senior leadership
- Perception of consultants as unnecessary expenditure

Cut expenditure on consultants, engage and leverage academic, professional staff and students to solve problems, create strategic plan and identity for ANU	Yes	Yes	Yes
Identify and remove all conflicts of interests in governance committees by the beginning of 2026	No	Yes	Yes
Senior leadership group to declare annual expenses to University community	No	Yes	Yes



Theme 9: Simplicity

Problem:

- Complex processes, information infrastructure, e.g., Figtree
- Quantity of reviews and changes, recommendation implementations
- Multiple and multi-dimensional priorities requiring whole-of-University reform

Review major processes, to include complaints, WHS reporting, associated reporting infrastructure and ensure these are simplified, easy to navigate, clear, and fit for purpose	No	Yes	Yes
Nixon Steering Group and Community Reference Panel to create joined-up recommendation implementation strategy with realistic and achievable (SMART) timeline	Yes	Yes	Yes



Theme 10: Restorative justice / practice

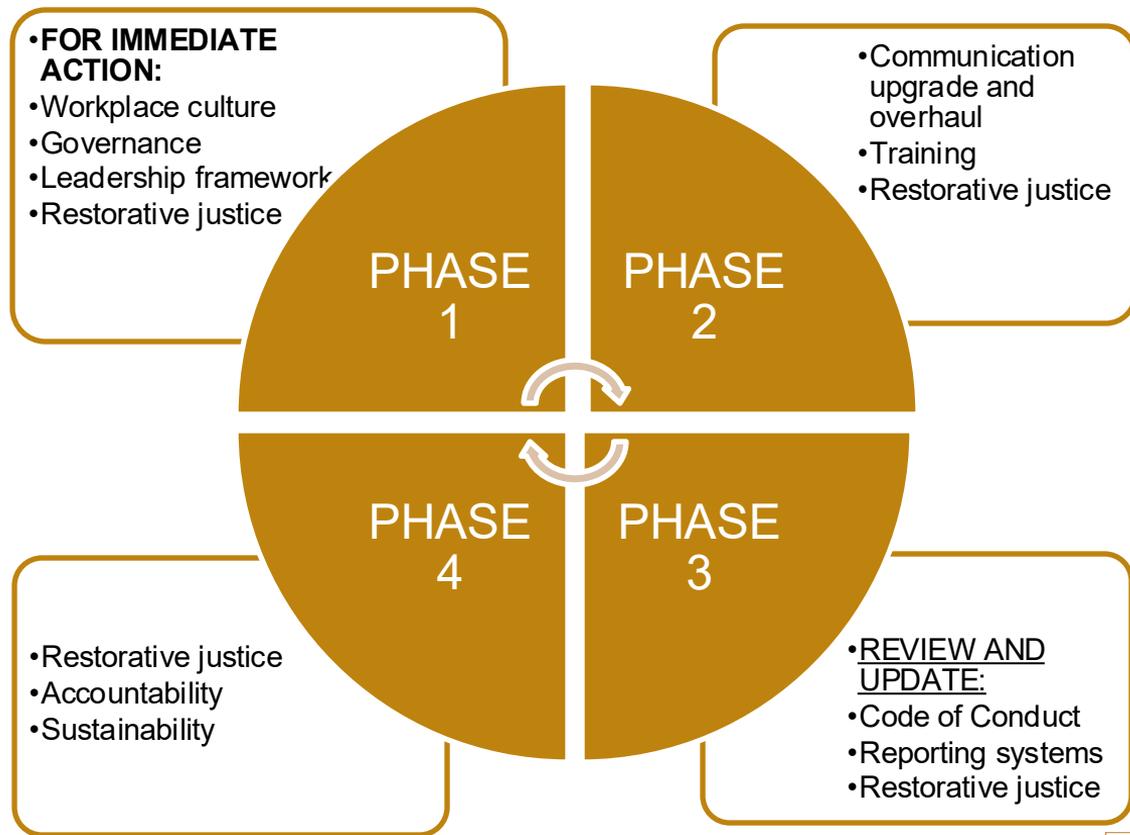
Problem:

- University-wide impact of Renew ANU
- Impact on mental health
- Continuing psychosocial safety and WHS risks
- Unresolved complaints and grievances

Continue with plan 'Advance Restorative Practices at ANU' with establishment of Expert Working Group, continuation of scoping activities, staff consultation mechanisms / period and timeline for pilots	No	Yes	Yes
Immediately identify and address areas of high psychosocial and WHS risk and implement immediate, short, medium, and long-term plan for reduction of risks	No	Yes	Yes
Continue to address impact on staff mental health by providing access to counsellors / counselling, more EAP appointments, private therapy / counselling that may be reimbursed	No	Yes	Yes

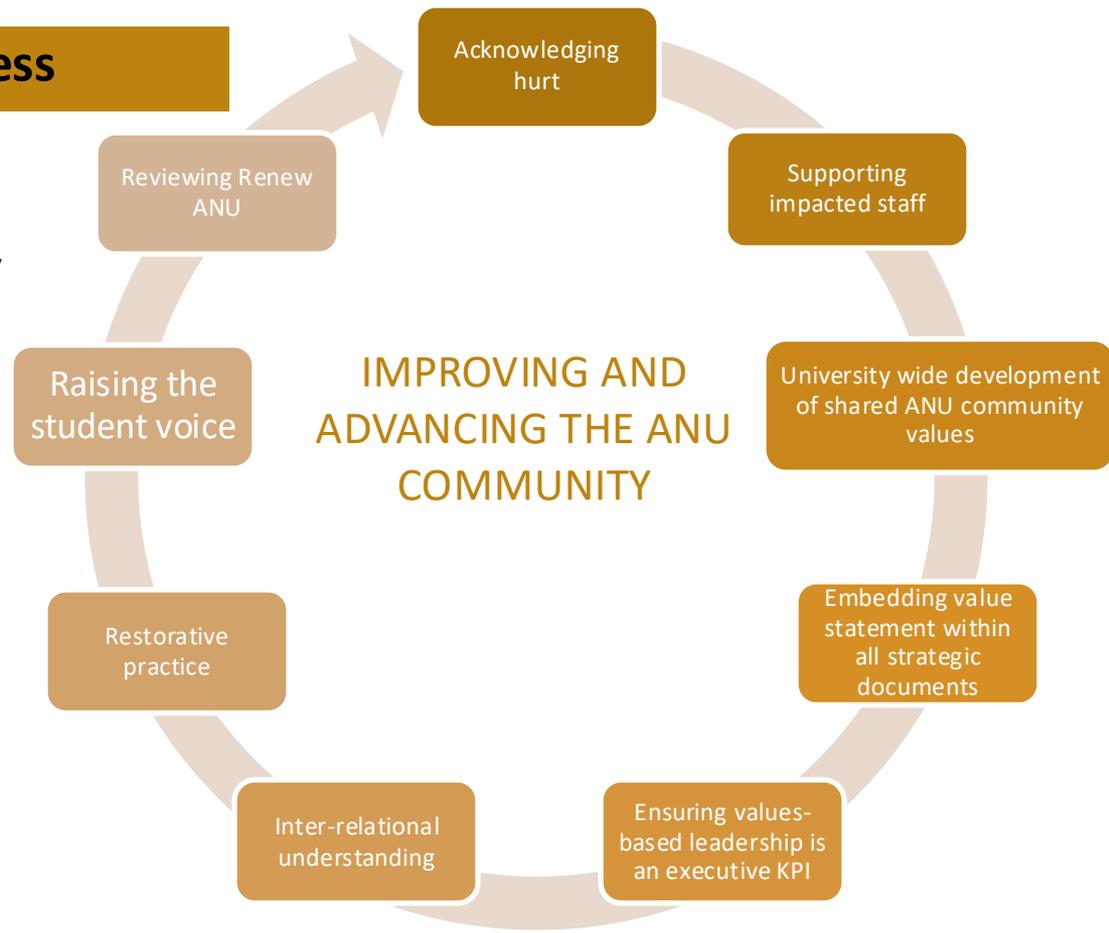


PHASED IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY (PROPOSAL)

Acknowledging ...

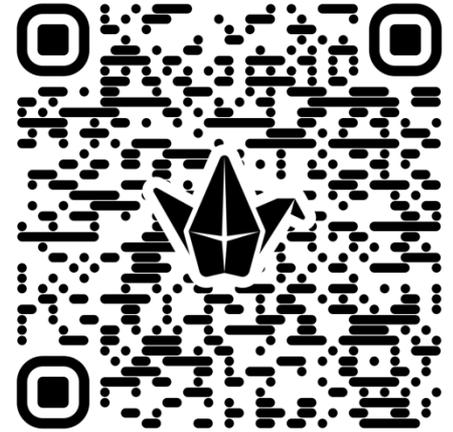
- Harm that has been done and people have been impacted

Inclusive community and culture	<p>Developing a culture of inclusion and belonging on campus. Recognising, acknowledging and celebrating Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander, First Generation, LGBTQIA+, CALD, and diverse ANU communities.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How can we be a more inclusive community? • How do we improve belonging for everyone at ANU? (PRES, QILT, ANU Survey data / results)
