

## THE AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF ASIA AND THE PACIFIC PAUL DIBB PRIZE FOR THIRD YEAR SECURITY STUDIES

## **Conditions of Award**

- 1. There shall be a prize of \$500 for award each year which shall be known as the Paul Dibb Prize for Third Year Security Studies.
- 2. The prize shall be awarded to the student who, in that year:
  - (i) was enrolled in a program leading to the award of the degree of Bachelor of Asia-Pacific Security or Bachelor of International Security Studies in the ANU College of Asia and the Pacific;
  - (ii) achieved the best result as shown by the award of the highest average mark in the courses STST3002 'Australia's Security in the Asian Century' and one of either STST3001 'Transnational Security Issues in the Asia-Pacific' or STST3003 'The Evolution and Roles of Australia's Security and Intelligence Organisations' or STST3004 'Advanced Study in Asia-Pacific Security'.
- 3. If any of the courses STST3002 'Australia's Security in the Asian Century', STST3001 'Transnational Security Issues in the Asia-Pacific', STST3003 'The Evolution and Roles of Australia's Security and Intelligence Organisations' or STST3004 'Advanced Study in Asia-Pacific Security' cease to be offered, the prize shall be awarded in respect of another course or courses the content of which is similar.
- 4. A student is not eligible to be awarded the prize if:
  - (iii) the student is making a second or subsequent attempt at either of the courses; or
  - (iv) the student has previously pursued a course of study in a course, unit or subject (whether at the University or another tertiary education institution), the content of which, is in the opinion of the Dean of the ANU College of Asia and the Pacific, substantially similar to the content of either of the courses for which the prize is to be awarded.
- 5. If, in any year, two or more students achieve the same top average mark, the prize money awarded in that year shall be divided equally between them.
- 6. If, in any year, no student achieves results that, in the opinion of the Dean of the ANU College of Asia and the Pacific justify awarding the prize in that year, the prize shall not be awarded.
