AUSTRALIAN PSYCHOLOGICAL SOCIETY (APS) PRIZE FOR SECOND YEAR PSYCHOLOGY

Conditions of Award

- 1. There shall be a prize of \$150 for award each year which shall be known as the Australian Psychological Society Prize for 2nd Year Psychology.
- 2. The prize shall be awarded to the student who, in that year:
 - (i) was enrolled in a program leading to the award of a degree of Bachelor in the ANU College of Science; and
 - (ii) achieved the best results, as shown by the award of the highest average mark, in two or more courses in the PSYC2000 range offered in that year.
- 3. A student is not eligible to be awarded the prize in any year if:
 - (i) the student has previously been awarded the prize
 - (ii) the student is making a second of subsequent attempt at any of the courses; or
 - (iii) the student has previously pursued a course of study in a course, unit or subject (whether at the University or another tertiary education institution), the content of which, is in the opinion of the Associate Dean (Education) substantially similar to the content of any of the courses for which the prize is to be awarded.
- 4. If, in any year, two or more students equally merit the award of the prize, the prize awarded for that year shall be divided equally between them.
- 5. If, in any year, no student achieves results that, in the opinion of the Associate Dean (Education), justify awarding the prize, the prize shall not be awarded for that year.
