IAIN WRIGHT PRIZE FOR ENGLISH

Conditions of Award

1. There shall be a prize of \$300 for award by Council each year which shall be known as the Iain Wright Prize for English.
2. This prize has been established to honour the memory of Professor Iain Wright, Professor of English from 1991-2006.
3. The prize shall be awarded each year to the student who in that year:
 - (i) was enrolled in a program leading to the award of a degree of Bachelor, offered by the ANU College of Arts and Social Sciences; and
 - (ii) achieved the highest average mark in at least two First-Year English courses at the ANU. The student must have been completed both of the First-Year English courses in one calendar year in order to be eligible for the award of the prize.
4. A student is not eligible to be awarded the prize in any year if:
 - (i) the student is making a second or subsequent attempt at any of the courses; or
 - (ii) the student has previously pursued a program of study in a course, unit or subject (whether at the University or another tertiary education institution), the content of which, is in the opinion of the Dean of the College of Arts and Social Sciences, substantially similar to the content of any of the courses for which the prize is to be awarded.
5. If, in any year, two or more students achieve the same top average mark, the prize awarded in that year shall be divided equally between them.
6. If, in any year, no student achieves results that, in the opinion of the Council justify awarding the prize in that year, the prize shall not be awarded in that year.
