KHAYYAM PRIZE FOR INTRODUCTORY PERSIAN LANGUAGE

Conditions of Award

1. There shall be a prize of \$500 for award each year which shall be known as the Khayyam Prize for Introductory Persian Language.
2. The prize shall be awarded each year to the student who, in that year:
 - (i) was enrolled in a program leading to the award of a degree of Bachelor;
 - (ii) was enrolled in *Introductory Persian B* PERS1002; and
 - (iii) achieved the best result as shown by the award of the highest aggregate mark in the courses *Introductory Persian A* PERS1001 (which may have been taken in that year or a previous year) and *Introductory Persian B*. PERS1002.
3. If either of the courses *Introductory Persian A* or *Introductory Persian B* cease to be offered, the prize shall be awarded in respect of another course or courses relating to Iranian studies, with the agreement of the prize donor.
4. A student is not eligible to be awarded the prize in any year if:
 - (i) the student is making a second of subsequent attempt at either of the courses listed in 2.(iii); or
 - (ii) the student has previously undertaken a course, unit or subject (whether at the University or another tertiary education institution), the content of which, is in the opinion of the Dean of the ANU College of Arts and Social Sciences, substantially similar to either or both of the course for which the prize is to be awarded.
5. If, in any year, two or more students achieve the same top aggregate mark, the prize awarded in that year shall be divided equally between them.
6. If, in any year, no student achieves results that, in the opinion of the Dean of the College of Arts and Social Sciences, justify awarding the prize, the prize shall not be awarded in that year.
