MICHAEL HARGRAVE PRIZE FOR OPHTHALMOLOGY

Conditions of Award

1. There shall be a prize of \$500 for award each year, which shall be known as the Michael Hargrave Prize for Ophthalmology.
2. The prize shall be awarded to the student who, in that year:
 - (i) was enrolled in Year Four of the Bachelor of Medicine Bachelor of Surgery Program in the ANU College of Medicine, Biology and Environment; and
 - (ii) who achieved a CRS in their MEDI 4001 and MEDI 4002 assessments; and
 - (iii) was one of the four candidates who performed best in knowledge and manual ability in the "Hands on Eyes" practical session held in week 1 of each term; and
 - (iv) obtained the highest mark in the formative multi-choice ophthalmology quiz conducted in Week 8 of the term; and, should it be required in the event of a tie
 - (v) had the highest result from any end-of-semester summative assessment in Ophthalmology.
3. The prize shall not be shared.
4. The Dean of Medicine and Health Sciences shall determine the Selection Committee, which shall include the Director of the ANU Medical Students' Ophthalmology Programme.
5. A student is not eligible to be awarded the prize in any year if:
 - (i) the student is making a second or subsequent attempt at any of the courses; OR
 - (ii) the student has previously pursued a course of study in a course, unit or subject (whether at the University or another tertiary education institution), the content of which, is in the opinion of the Dean of Medicine and Health Sciences, substantially similar to the content of any of the courses for which the prize is to be awarded.
6. If, in any year, no student performance is assessed, in the opinion of the Dean of Medicine and Health Sciences, as justifying the award of the prize in that year, the prize shall not be awarded in that year.
